On Wednesday morning the band will perform for the children in a special concert following up with music and dancing workshops to prepare the children to help them perform in a combined student and band concert for the community at 5.30pm on Wednesday evening.

The combined small schools camps are a great highlight for all the students and provide them with great learning and socialising opportunities. We realise that without help from our parents, holding a camp would be impossible and therefore we thank all parents in advance for their help.

Priority Schools Program (PSP)

In March, 2012 we will be taking part in a survey in an attempt to qualify for the next round of the PSP Funding Program which will be in effect from 2013-2016. The Priority Schools Program provides additional funding, staffing and consultancy services to schools which are identified as Priority Schools. Priority Schools are those which serve communities with the highest concentrations of low socio-economic status families.

The survey measures: type of occupation of parents/caregivers, educational qualifications of parents/caregivers, proportion of sole parent families in the school community, unemployment in families and the proportion of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander families in the school community. If we are found to qualify, the additional resources provided will be very beneficial to our students and staff.

The survey is short and returned to school in a sealed envelope so that all information remains confidential. As survey time approaches there will be further updates in the newsletter and on our website.
